Workshop outline (learning outcomes)

- To offer a lively refresher of dialogism and the dialogic self what this means and building understanding of the rich Bakhtinian concepts that underpin this.
- Joining a "community of voices" by sharing experiences and engaging in dialogue together.
- Presentation of case material illustrating examples of dialogic ways of working.
- To consider how jointly creating and using shared signs can deepen the work of therapy and allow for a reparative experience (recognition and revision).
- Exploration of how these often elusive-seeming ideas can be incorporated into your own therapy work in real practical terms.
- Time to experiment through use of role-play and small group work to try out new ways of working and practice the different techniques.
- Encouragement to consider how to build your own practical resources and take forward your learning from the day.
